


ACTIVITIES REPORT

Since my appointment occurred in early November, I have re-acquainted myself with the historian's files. some old and some new; published an article on the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Lima Masons, which included its history and helped a Maryland man find family members in our cemeteries. I am also working on a scrapbook of Lima people and events and have begun research on Underground Railroad stations that might have been located in Lima.
