BRUSH PICK-UP: will be the week of July 17-21. All brush (only brush will be picked up) must be cut in manageable lengths (no larger than 6" in diameter) and placed parallel to the roadside in neat piles before July 17th at 8:00 am. The village will only make one (1) trip down each street. The next brush pick-up will be the week of September 18th. **Leaves, grass clippings, and walnuts will only be picked up if placed in biodegradable bags.**

FIRE HYDRANTS: Hydrants will be flushed the week of September 11th from 7:30 am to 3:30 pm. Please excuse the inconvenience, as the water may be roily during this time.

FIRE WORKS: The Village and Town of Lima are providing fireworks on Tuesday, July 4th, at Mark Tubbs Park starting at 9:45 pm.

PESTICIDES: Please inform your neighbors when putting down lawn chemicals.

CROSSROADS FESTIVAL: The annual Crossroads Festival will be held on August 5th. Bed Race to start at 1:00 pm. Fanatics will be hosting the Crossroads Blues Festival on August 4th – 6th. Mark your Calendars!

DOG LEASH LAW: Section 5-14-C states that a dog cannot deposit waste or commit a nuisance on private property, sidewalks, or in Mark Tubbs Park. Please pick up after your dog.

YARD SALES: Only three (3) yard sales are allowed per household each year. Please remove all your signs after your sale is over.

COMMUNITY CHOICE AGGREGATION FOR ELECTRICAL CUSTOMERS: The Village of Lima is presently conducting research to determine if Village residents will benefit from joining a Community Choice Aggregation (CCA) electricity buying program. A CCA allows electrical customers from multiple municipalities to join together to form a single entity for purchasing electricity. Westchester County municipalities were the first in NYS to form a CCA and this resulted in lower electrical rates and an increase in the use of renewable energy. At our June 13th Village Board meeting, Glenn Weinberg from Joule Assets and Ben Frevert from RPCC answered questions regarding the impact that joining a CCA with Monroe County municipalities will have on our electrical rates and service.
