MARCH 2017 NEWSLETTER

BRUSH PICK-UP: will be the week of April 17-21. All brush (only brush will be picked up) must be cut in manageable lengths (no larger than 6" in diameter and no longer than 10 feet) and placed parallel to the roadside in neat piles before Apr. 17th at 8:00 am. The village will only make one (1) trip down each street. The next brush pick-up will be the week of July 17.

LEAVES: Leaves will be picked up only if in brown biodegradable paper bags. **No plastic bags!**

FIRE HYDRANTS: Hydrants will be flushed the week of April 10th – 14th from 7:30 am to 3:30 pm. Please excuse the inconvenience, as the water may be riley during this time.

FIRE WORKS: The Village and Town of Lima are providing fireworks on Tuesday, July 4th, at Mark Tubbs Park starting at 9:45 pm.

PESTICIDES: Please inform your neighbors when putting down lawn chemicals.

BUILDING INSPECTOR: As you think about home improvements this year, please don't forget to obtain building permits, fence permits or pool permits. Pools are defined as any container (blow up pools included) that are capable of holding 24" or more of water depth. A pool also requires a protective fence around it. HFL SUMMER RECREATION: The camp will be located at HFL High School and bus transportation from and to the Lima Primary School will be available each day of the program. Camp will run from June 26, 2017 to August 4, 2017 ((9:00 – 3:00). Children entering grades 1-8 are eligible to participate. Teens entering grades 9 -11 are eligible for the CIT program. Wrap around care (6:30 – 9:00 am and 3:00 – 6:00 pm) is also available through their Cougar Care. SPRING CLEAN UP: is May 19th and May 20th. **Only two (2) pick-up loads per household.** Hazardous waste, paint, tires, batteries, brush, air conditioners, computer monitors, wire fence and contractor debris will not be accepted. **NO TV'S OR ELECTRONICS.** Collection on Friday May 19th and Saturday, May 20th is from 8 am – noon at the village garage. Senior Citizens (65 years or older) can arrange for pick-up by calling the village office at 624-2210 by 4pm on May 16th and pick-up will be on May 18th.

VILLAGE DATES – 2017

We schedule a **BRUSH PICK-UP** three (3) times a year. This year they are April 17-21, July 17-21 and September 18-22. Please have your brush out before **8:00 am on the Monday** morning beginning the week or you will miss pick-up. Leaves, Walnuts and Grass Clippings will **NOT** be picked up unless in biodegradable paper bags. **Please do not put brush out except during brush pick-up weeks.**

Hydrant flushing is April 10th – 14th and September 11th – 15th.

VILLAGE CLEAN-UP DAYS will be May 19th and 20th from 8:00 am until noon at the Village Barns located at 7362 Dublin Ave.

Memorial Day Parade will be May 29th starting at 9:30 am.

July 4th Fireworks will be at Mark Tubbs Park at 9:45 pm.

Scheduled **LEAF PICK-UP** begins around October 16th and ends November 20th or after the first snowfall. Once again walnuts will not be picked up unless in **BIODEGRADABLE BAGS**. Also please do **NOT** put brush or debris in the leaf piles. We have found lumber, metal, large sticks as well as even a baseball bat in the piles. This will break the leaf machine and stop leaf pick up. If you do have some brush debris, put it in a separate pile next to the leaves and we will try to pick it up depending on available time.
